




EQIP - LOWER LOUP AND MIDDLE REPUBLICAN NRD'S | POSTCARD








RANCHER DRIVEN, SCIENCE INFORMED, AGENCY SUPPORTED

Woody plant encroachment puts pressure on working rangelands by decreasing livestock production and increasing wildfire risk as well as harming grassland biodiversity and increasing threat to animal species living in this biome.

NRCS is adopting a new approach to address this widespread threat through the Nebraska Great Plains Grassland Initiative (GPGI). The initiative is part of the NRCS Working Lands for Wildlife (WLFW) framework calling to conserve the last remaining iconic grassland regions in the Great Plains biome.

The GPGI initiative makes ranchers in targeted rangelands (see map below) eligible to receive Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) funding related to addressing woody plant encroachment. This EQIP Initiative provides an opportunity for producers to reduce the vulnerability of Nebraska core grasslands from woody encroachment.

Dear Landowner,

There is currently an open enrollment sign-up period for the Natural Resources Conservation Service's (NRCS) Agricultural Conservation Easement Program (ACEP). A tentative cutoff is set for October 1st, 2023. To ensure eligible producers are aware of this opportunity we wanted to provide you with an overview of the program ahead of the sign-up deadline.

ACEP provides a variety of options for flood-prone cropland or wetland acres. The Wetland Reserve Easement (WRE) option compensates landowners at up to 95% of appraised land value for acres enrolled in ACEP – WRE. The wetland and associated upland buffer are restored to benefit wildlife, recharge the aquifer, and reduce runoff to minimize flood damage.

Another option is the Wetland Reserve Enhancement Partnership (WREP) easement option. This option allows landowners to retain the ability to pass a pivot over enrolled acres. This ensures enrolled acres do not negatively impact irrigation of the adjacent cropland acres. Like with the WRE option the landowner is compensated for enrolled acres and restoration costs.

With WREP options the Rainwater Basin Joint Venture partnership can provide 85% cost-share for infrastructure, such as fencing, livestock watering systems, pivot crossings in the fence, and pivot modifications to facilitate crossing the wetland (e.g., flotation tires) and improve irrigation efficiency (e.g. Variable Rate Irrigation components).






